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Purpose of this Report

Every October, Deltek identifies and assesses the top 10 professional services federal contract opportunities for the new fiscal year.

The FY 2024 Top 10 professional services opportunities total contract value is more than \$62.7B, consisting of prime contract opportunities from a variety of agencies and industry segments.

This report reveals key trends and patterns in the procurements as compared to prior years to assist vendors in their business development.






Follow-on Opportunities Account for 95% of the Professional Services FY 2024 Top 10 Total Contract Value

- FY 2024 Top Professional Services opportunities total \$62.7B
 - » The total contract value for FY 2024 decreased 63% from FY 2023
 - » The dramatic spike in FY 2023 was driven by GSA's OASIS+ vehicle (\$133.7B)
- » Follow-ons range from consolidations like Army's PD Aerostats MATOC IDIQ to traditional recompetes like DHS's PACTS III and DoD's CTRIC IV
- » USAID's PSA HIV is the only new requirement on the FY 2024 list, and has a government-determined ceiling value of \$3B



DoD Leads in Highest Overall Value and Number of Opportunities, Energy Leads in Single Highest Valued Opportunity







DoD Opportunities Represent 28% of the FY 2024 Professional Services Top 10 Total Contract Value

- » The FY 2024 list is out of eight departments, with DoD leading in the number of opportunities; three opportunities totaling \$17.3B
 - » The remaining departments have one opportunity each
- » Energy's M&O LBNL makes up \$16.6B of the FY 2024 Top 10 total contract value
- » Opportunities with the lowest ceiling value are out of USAID and HHS; both \$3B


Full and Open Competitions Account for 67% of the Professional Services FY 2024 Top 10 Total Contract Value

- Five out of the six opportunities on the FY 2024 list with Unrestricted competition types are follow-ons for a combined total of ~\$39B.
- » DHS's PACTS III (\$5.6B) is planned to have awards under 8(a), HUBZone, SDVOSB, and WOSB categories.
- » Two requirements, Commerce's ProTech 2.0 Weather Domain (\$8B), and Army's PD Aerostats MATOC IDIQ (\$4.1B) anticipate both Unrestricted and Set-Aside acquisitions.
- » HHS's NEC (\$3B) is the only requirement on the FY 2024 list with an undetermined competition type and was previously competed as Full and Open.

 - » Seven are recompetes of major contract vehicles
- » Energy's M&O LBNL (\$16.6B) requirement and USAID's PSA HIV (\$3B) requirement anticipate awards to a single vendor
